- By 2020, waste is managed as a resource. Waste generated per capita is in absolute decline.
- Recycling and re-use of waste are economically attractive options for public and private actors due to widespread separate collection and the development of functional markets for secondary raw materials.

- Waste legislation is fully implemented. Illegal shipments of waste have been eradicated.
- Energy recovery is limited to non recyclable materials, landfilling is virtually eliminated and high quality recycling is ensured.

#### The Commission will:

- Stimulate the secondary materials market and demand for recycled materials (in 2013/2014);
- Review existing prevention, reuse, recycling, recovery and landfill diversion targets (2014)



□ Ensure that public funding from the EU budget gives priority to activities higher up the waste hierarchy as defined in the Waste Framework Directive (e.g. priority to recycling plants over waste disposal) (in 2012/2013)

#### Market structure and trends

Concentration: 3 largest companies 50% more turnover than the following 13 smaller companies

One third are private owned companies, two-thirds is public, but increasing role for the private sector

#### Employment

## New jobs through greening?

- New functions: sorting, consulting, high-tech and engineering
- Sorting: a problem zone of fast-paced, low-wage, risky conveyor belt work
- Some secondary labour market in recycling
   (IT)
- Skill upgrading (environmental consulting)
  limited (IT, DK)



#### Quality of work

- Workload intensification (also in public sector)
- Uneven and difficult representation and social partnership
- ▶ Limited time of contracts → losses of tenure with new contract
- Unequal working conditions for new entrants
  - = fragmentation of workforce
